Brian mentioned that William had given up his "day time" job and turned Professional Photographer earlier in 2015 after 8 years as an Air Conditioning Technician. William is relatively new to photography, picking up a camera in 2012 that took him on a new venture in life. As William says "... Through photography I have developed a deep appreciation for nature and learned to understand and admire life's simplicity ..."

Geoff Gray chaired this part of the evening's programme and introduced the Judge, William Patino. William thanked the Club for the invitation and said that judging the Club's Annual Photography Awards was a first. William then commented generally that all entrants' images were good and the final decisions were difficult.

Colour Prints "A" Grade

There were 18 entries from 9 entrants in this year's Colour Print "A" Grade of the Year Competition.

Title and **Image Judge's Comments Photographer** The image jumps out at you straight away. The photographer has captured the moment with a good reflection of the tree as it breaks "Reflections" the horizon. The photographer timed the Bernie Gromek action precisely. In this case the full reflection adds to the total image as normally I would suggest using a partial reflection. Wildlife Photography. The moment requires "Give It To Me Mum" patience and getting the technical aspects right before operating the shutter button. The Vivienne Noble photographer nailed the focus. William said he studied this image and that it was an "out of character" image for him but it just grew on him. He said the longer he "Red Gerberas" looked at the image the more the image's story developed and grew. The vignetting Geoff Gray drew his attention into this developing "story" of life and death with the final single petal on the ground.





President's Award

Brian asked the audience if anyone remembered 1944, the year that the Wollongong Camera Club was first formed. There were a few hands raised, though respecting their "age" they were a few years short of 71 as that is how long the Club has been running. Brian continue with the Club's history saying that there have been different phases throughout this 71 Year period; Monochrome Prints, Colour Slides, Colour Prints, Audio Visuals, Small Prints, EDI's (Electronically Displayed Images) and the development of the Video and Movie Makers. Throughout this time the Club has been guided and managed by stable Management Committees. Brian then spoke briefly about changes that occurred to Clubs in general in the late 1980's, particularly in 1988 where club Management Committees, especially the Presidents, Treasurers and Secretaries, were being sued and losing their homes due to "Public Liability" actions against particular clubs. These were the days when clubs were not incorporated.

In 1989 the Wollongong Camera Club embarked upon the road to "Association Incorporation" with the club finally being granted Incorporation status on December 4th 1990. Brian said that it is almost to the date that the Club has been Incorporated for 25 Years.

Brian said that during this time the Club has had just one (1) Public Officer; Bruce Shaw and that the President's Award is presented to Bruce.

Bruce thanked Brian, his fellow club members, particularly those who has served on the Management Committees over the years for their service and assistance. Bruce also thanked his wife, Sue, for her patience and support throughout their time at the club, without this support this Award wouldn't been possible.



Brian closed the evening thanking:

- 1. his Management Committee and all members for working together for the advancement of the club;
- 2. The Villa D'oro staff; and finally
- 3. His wife, Kath.

Brian then wished everyone a very Happy Christmas and all the best for 2016.

The 2015 Photography Group Competition In Review


The 2015 Monthly Competitions continued to build on the changes introduced for the 2014 Competitions. The Member Grading was reviewed in January 2015 resulting in a number of Print Workers being upgraded from either:

- Small Print (C Grade) to Large Prints (B Grade). There were 2 members upgraded to the Large Prints "B" Graded based upon their success and consistent Competition Entries during the 2014 Year; or
- Large Print "B" Grade to "A" Grade. There were 4 member adjustments; again these were based upon the member's 2014 Competition results.

The 2015 Competition Year saw a total 681 Images across six (6) categories presented for critiquing. The actual number of images presented was in fact greater as there were a number of visitors who had images entered for the judge to critique, however these don't appear in the Members' Pointscore. The table below is a breakdown of the various categories:
