#### A Girls' Day Out

On Sunday 22 December 2019, Club members Sue Martin, Cheryl Thompson and Kaz Childs took the train to see Len Metcalf's 2019 Masterclass Exhibition in Surry Hills. Kerry Gilmore has been a student of Len's during 2019 and they were all excited to be there so support Kerry and view her work, as well as the other students'.

Kerry's work looked fantastic up on the gallery wall, and she was rightfully beaming. Her pictorial series of three water images, all with beautiful, soft movement; and colours with soft light and blue and orange tones. Len said that Kerry "found her home" in this work and he was obviously well chuffed with not just her photography but also how Kerry has grown as an artist along the way.

When asked to speak of what she had learned during the Masterclass, Kerry talked about how the photographer already has an emotional connection to their work because they were there; but "you need to find a way to make the photo(s)

meaningful to someone else". Several people commented on different aspects of Kerry's work that they loved, including palette, direction and "paintiliness".

Some of the other students featured at the exhibition were Lee Cleland, whose work was even more "paintily" than Kerry's and had a Shirley Steel look about them – blurred, pastel and dreamy like impressionists' paintings. There was also Anne Robinson, who submitted some of her older photos of colourful, textured rocks after discovering throughout the Masterclass that she actually has a passion for shooting...rocks! Hazel Hewlett-Smith had three images of perfect, white flowers on black backgrounds inspired by her English upbringing. Hazel discovered that shooting flowers that reminded her of home made her feel more comfortable being all the way over here in Australia.

Pamela Handyside also discovered something – how much she adores working in black and white – whilst being a student of Len's over the last 6 years. It wasn't just her three strikingly bold, architectural images that were very impressive... Pamela is now in her 90s and still developing as an artist!

Len spoke on each series of images in detail, encouraging discussion and divulging some of the techniques used to capture them. The afternoon was dotted with handy pieces of advice from Len, which in summary are:

- Using an orange filter in camera and then in Lightroom<sup>®</sup>, then adjusting the blues, helps to hide blemishes, veins and unevenness and helps achieve a lovely, light skin tone.
- Get amazingly rich black & white images from Lightroom by bringing the tone range sliders in from each side until you have a straight vertical line in the middle.
- The half hour just after sunset is actually the best part of sunset time, so stick around for a while.
- When viewing imagery, keep asking yourself why you like something.
- Find an artist whose work you love and play with it, using it as inspiration for your own work.
- Photograph your own passion.
- Print things that you would like to hang on your *own* wall.
- Write out the list of "rules"... then go and break every one of them.

We all found Len to be very giving of himself and he is not a 'hard sell kind of guy'. For anyone interested in his classes – and there are several different ones – you can find information on his website:

catch up time, what's happening and new photographic acquisitions whilst waiting for the first session. The group was met by the Cycle Club's representative who requested that picture taking before 6:30pm be held off as this was

the Under 18's Cycle Club members' time to practice. This time period permitted the Camera Club members to find their "spot" around the velodrome for their vantage point to capture the images they were planning. It also provide a brief time for some members to practice panning action as the cyclists rushed by.

At 6:30 it was the adults' session with about 20 cyclists in a 100 lap training session comprising of eight (8)

laps behind a motorcyclist controlling the group's speed before dropping off to allow the cyclists to sprint 2 laps. Then then regrouped and repeated this activity again. 100 laps seems like a long time however the intermittent sprints certainly reduced the overall time.



Throughout the evening we watched the various cyclists practice various drills from passing, changing the lead rider by "sling shooting" a rider from behind grabbing the hand of the front rider to drag the behind rider to speed and become the new lead rider.

It was an interesting night, being able to test our skills in panning and sports motion. It wasn't all camera action with a social side to chat and see what other have been up to in during the past 7 weeks. It's a credit to Kaz that she has been able to arrange another action outing for the members to learn and share.



#### MyPhotoClub 2020 Updates


As mentioned in the Editorial the MPC System has several new features incorporated into the 2020 update, especially on the Members page that is designed to allow the member to "... access upload forms, members directory and view all your entries." I suggest that you read the following whilst logged into the website and at the "Members" page.

On the Members Page, along the top left hand side are five (5) feature buttons (View All My Entries, Pointscores, Members Directory, Critique Corner and Membership Renewal). At the top right hand side under the MyPhotoClub logo is the "Help" button. Here's a brief explanation to the new features:

- **Membership Renewal**. This is a new, update feature to bringing all the information pertaining to renewing your membership. Information displayed on this page:
  - is the Schedule Fees;
  - Payment Instructions including referencing your payment; and
  - Who to contact if you are problems.




The "Membership Renewal" is the right button as highlighted above.




To assist the Treasurer members are requested to use the referencing as noted near the bottom of Membership Fees page. It contains: "MPCID-YourName" eg 0000-John Doe

■ Help. This isn't a new feature but one that is most likely well underutilised by members to provide help on the various features and functions through a FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions) and Tutorial Videos. The light blue button "All Features and Demonstration Videos" located at the bottom of the "Members" pop-up Information page is where the various videos can be seen covering topics under 4 main groups. If you haven't visited this area yet, take the journey to learn more about the MyPhotoClub's features. Just remember that the videos are on the MyPhotoClub Demonstration site which should open to a new tab in your browser.




Location of the "Help" Button



Members Page Features' Brief Explanation

- Critique Corner. This is a new feature to "... use this option to upload images for other members to critique and to critique the image yourself." This feature:
  - The Green Button Function (Upload, Change or Delete Your Critique Corner Entries)
    - > Opens the normal Entry Form;
    - Select, Load and Add "title" as required; and
    - > "Submit" your image for critiquing.
  - The Blue Button Function (View or Comment on Critique Corner Images)
    - Select the image you want to comment on;
    - Write your comments as required; and
    - > "Save" your comments with the Save Button.
    - An email is generated and sent to the members.
  - *The Red Button Function* (To Unsubscribe from the Critique Corner Notifications)
    - ➤ All members are automatically "Subscribers" to this feature; and
    - ➤ Use this button to "Unsubscribe" (Remove) from all future Critique Corner Notifications.
