<b>What?</b>	Street Photography big day out
<b>Where?</b>	See page 4 for an overview
<b>The plan:</b>	<p>We will arrive at each destination and decide as a group, how long we should spend in that place. For example, one hour here, half an hour there... We'll spread out (somewhat) at each location to avoid drawing too much attention to our group, and increase the number of different perspectives on potential subjects.</p> <p>When the time is up, we'll reconvene and move to the next location. Rinse and repeat!</p>
<b>Why?</b>	<p>We have a set subject of Street coming up in September. This field trip will give you many opportunities to capture something interesting.</p>
<b>Definition for the purposes of September's competition:</b>	<p>"Street photography is a non-formalised genre of photography that features subjects in candid situations within public places such as streets, parks, beaches, malls, political conventions and other associated settings. Images can often be ironic or emotionally detached from subject matter, focusing instead on a particular context or detail. Framing and timing are key aspects of the craft, with the aim of creating images at a decisive or poignant moment."</p>
