## Presidents Report Wollongong Camera Club March 2023

It is my privilege and honour to present my President's Report for the 2023 AGM. The club has maintained its strong membership numbers throughout 2022, with 57 current financial members. This is the first year since 2019 that the club was able to meet without lockdown restrictions. Normality, we hope, has been re-established, which I am sure the members appreciate.

Clubs survive on the strength of their members, both those in leadership roles and their active members, and this quality was again demonstrated by our members last year. This is a characteristic of the club that I have always found rewarding and encouraging.

While members who take on a role on the club committee do so voluntarily, I would like to thank the committee for its dedication to the club and its passion for photography this year to always work in the members' best interest. Apart from the ongoing running of the club, there have been some matters worthy of mention. A new online system for welcoming new members to the club and registering them has been established. Also established is a system to purchase merchandise online, which members may use when selling their images to the public.

Aligned with the new online member registration is the ongoing development of a mentoring program to ensure that new members become familiar with the mechanics of how the club works and some encouragement. This is still in the developmental stage but is a very worthy initiative that is dependent on more experienced members' support.

Kaz is still organizing club outings for members to visit and socialise at various locations while searching for that Best in Section image. This is an initiative that is offered by few other clubs but has the potential to enrich members' experience. Kaz stepped down from the committee at the end of 2021 but has come back as strong as ever, for which we are grateful.

At the 2022 AGM, a call went out for a volunteer to step into the vacant Secretary's role, however, none was found. After some consultation, Sue Curtis and Kerry Gilmore agreed to work together to share the secretarial duties. This has proved successful and may become a template for future committees where the role of the club Secretary is too daunting for a single person.

Les Schumer, Webmaster, Sue Martin, Treasurer and Tim Porteous, Competition Director, have all worked diligently to improve the experience for club members.

I would also like to that Simon Bastin for taking on the role to find guest speakers for the first meeting of the month. Wollongong Camera Club was asked to host the 2022 Federation of Camera Clubs (FCC) Topshot Competition in August last year. While most of the organisation was carried out by the FCC committee, it still brought some prestige to the club. It was very pleasing to see so many members enter prints in the competition and so many receive acceptance.

I would like to thank Colin and Carol Marshman for the opportunity for the club to use the Red Point Artist Association's gallery to exhibit members' prints in May last year. Some prints were purchased by members of the public and at least one visitor to the exhibition, Greg Powell, later joined the club. The exhibition was well promoted by the club, including a mention on i98 Facebook. An Opening held on the first Saturday of the exhibition proved very successful and may be used again for our Court House Exhibition in September this year.

The Creative group still meet on the third Tuesday of the month when the hall is not bused by the Movie Makers and at other times they may meet online. This is an enthusiastic group who are pushing its creative boundaries. The group is small in number but is open to anybody in the club. Members are encouraged to contact committee members for more details.

The publishing of the Association Incorporation Regulation 2022 lead to a revision of the club's constitution to align with the revised regulation. This is necessary to ensure that the club is covered by the Association Incorporation Act 2009, which protects members from any possible litigation. The majority of this revision work was undertaken by the Club's Public Officer, Bruce Shaw. However, it required the committee to review and approve the revision before taking it to the members' final acceptance. Revision 4 of the Constitution, dated February 2023, is now available on the club's website.

Wollongong Camera Club has had a wonderful relationship with Figtree Heights Public School over a number of years or decades. As the club held so few meetings in the hall in 2021, the school offered the hall free of charge for 2022. However, due to our ongoing relationship and the fact that our gear is continually stored in the hall, the committee decided to make a donation of \$1,000 to the school. The usual annual fee is about this amount. We felt it appropriate.

Most of the committee members are willing to stand again for the 2023 committee. However, I will be stepping down after serving for two years as club president. It has been an honour and privilege to take on this role. I want to thank the committee and members for their support over the past two years. I have always tried to put the interest of members first. I am confident that the work of the committee over the past years has left the club in a strong position for the incoming committee.
